The Rotaract Club of Toronto is pleased to present its annual report for the year 2022-2023. This report outlines the club's achievements, activities, and impact in serving the community, fostering professional development, and promoting international understanding.

Over the past year, our club has been able to grow from last year to be comparable to our pre-Covid membership size of 41 members. We welcomed 8 new members, all of whom embody

the values of Rotary and demonstrate a deep commitment to making a positive difference in our community.

We have been focused on partnering with other agencies such as the St. James Town Community Arts and Global Medic for volunteering opportunities. We have donated \$2,200+ to organizations such as Rotary Wheels of Life, the St. James Town Community Art, AgRI and soon The 519. In addition to our service projects, we have focused on fostering the professional and personal development of our members through engagement with the Rotary Club of Toronto's events which included speakers across industries.

Lastly, there have been many organizational changes in our club's administration. We have been focused on improving the member experience from creating a prospective member guide to a digital attendance form, all of which can be found on our website. We have been a leader in Diversity, Equality and Inclusion by passing an Event Code of Conduct, an Ethics Policy and a digital form to submit ethics concerns. This year our President and Co Vice-President made efforts to connect with every member to get feedback and we have started on a Non-Profit Incorporation proposal. Lastly, we have created a robust leader training program so that any member joining our leadership team will have the tools and resources they need to succeed in their role.

It will be my last year serving as President and I am so proud of how much we have transformed and achieved. Whether it was volunteering with a youth choir, singing karaoke or networking with other Rotary clubs or the district, we are proud of our members' dedication and the positive impact we have made. As we look towards the future, we remain committed to serving our community, fostering professional development, and promoting international understanding.



 Most members keep coming to the club because they are passionate about service and volunteering (29), want to network and develop professionally (21) and to meet new people and make friends (18)






 When it comes to Rotary's six areas of focus, our member's care most about Sanitation and hygiene (18), Protecting the environment (17) and Growing local economies (16)

Top 10 Skills Members Want to Work On






Most of our members 28 - 31 years old, for next year we should do more to encourage younger members to join to achieve age diversity






Almost 60% of our members have been with us for 2 years or less which means that many of our members are newer to the club and 41% have not been part of another Rotary organization such as Interact, Rotaract or Rotary




Almost 58% of our members are active (i.e attend at least once a month or more frequently); this is great but for next year we should continue to focus on member engagement with yearly coffee chats with the President / Vice-President, hosting a variety of events that are of interest to our club and encouraging a diverse leadership team for our committee chairs



Most of our members, 89%, feel comfortable sharing concerns with the Rotaract Club of Toronto Board of Chairs. While there is room for improvement, we are pleased that most members do feel comfortable confiding in their club leaders



There has been a huge improvement in the number of members who know about the Ethics Committee with 64% knowing about the Ethics Committee but other members either don't know how to share a concern with them or don't know about the Ethics Committee



Administration

This year our Secretary Ahmed Mrad brought their professional insights to improve the member experience supported by efforts from the President Lara Valles and Co-Vice Presidents Farah Karim and Irene Kwan.

Highlights

- Inducted 8 new members
- Digitalized the Attendance Form which is now available on the website and takes member only a minute to complete
- Hosted Prospective Member Q&A sessions at the end of in-person general meetings
- Created the OG Rotaractors, a buddy system of prospective/new members and older members where prospective/new members are paired with an older member to meet with them and ask questions
- Created an Event Guide to help with event planning such as the financial transaction process, how to plan a social media campaign etc.
- Automated and improved club directory and attendance tracking for members and prospective members
- This year over 98% of members completed a survey, a practice we will be continuing on an annual basis, to ensure that our club directory is up to date
- Created a Prospective Member Information package which is sent to anyone who subscribes to our newsletter
- Drafted Prospective/New Member Session presentation and next year will look to organize meetings to present this information
- Organized our second Steering Committee Retreat to foster team building and communication skills
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- Started the Non-Profit Incorporation Proposal
- Board Member attends Rotary Club of Toronto monthly meetings to present updates and look for opportunities of collaboration

Administration

- Complete the Non-Profit Incorporation Proposal and implement
- Continue to find ways to streamline the Club's administration practices
- Start enforcing good member standing
- Feedback from Member Chat Feedback
- Include member in good standing requirements and how much funds we have raised or donated on website
- Need to have more events, especially volunteering and professional development events and some have a preference for a variety of events rather than just recurring events
- Should share Board Meeting Minutes in Slack
- Our club is very welcoming to newcomers and is great with hosting fun social events
- Appreciate the mix of virtual and in-person events



Public Image



This year our Public Image Director Leticia Devens, supported by Co Vice-President Farah Karim who took over Public Image duties starting December 2023, continued to support our public image by developing tools and executing our social media strategy.

Highlights

- Created consistent social media campaigns for each general meeting and event
- Sent out newsletters weekly and posted to social media to promote different events
- Organized Steering Committee Photoshoot at the steering committee retreat
- Supported other committee member in their development

- Create and connect all accounts to a social media scheduling tool
- Continue to post frequently for events and upcoming general meetings and also post-events
- Update the website so it is more mobile-friendly

Club Service Committee

This was the second year that the club had a Club Service Committee. The Club Service Committee Chair Alok Deshpande ensured that all members and prospective members had the chance to contribute and ensured that we had many social and networking opportunities throughout the year.

Highlights

- Every month a social and/or planning meeting was organized. With COVID-19 restrictions being lifted, all events were in-person and most events were low-cost as requested by the Board
- This years' socials included:

 - o a trivia night at a local bar
 - o a picnic and street festival at Queen's Park
 - o a Halloween haunted walk at Casa Loma and dinner
 - o a workshop on healthy living to support our membership with their fitness
 - o and many more!
- Our Holiday Party at Storm Crow Manor was attended by more than 20 members, many of whom were either new to the club or had not been active in a long time. We also made it a charity toy collection event for Toy Mountain!
- We promoted much more to individuals and groups outside of the Rotary/Rotaract community than in the past, which led to our membership increasing. This helps us bring fresh ideas and perspectives to the club.
- For example, we are initiating a collaboration with a Toastmasters club in the city

- Also continue to post our events on alternate social media platforms to reach out to a more diverse audience

- Continue to promote Ethics Committee to improve members awareness of it
